The Swedish Board of Agriculture hereby certifies that Sweden is free from the following diseases.

Aujeszky's disease (AD) Sweden is regarded free from AD according to European Commission Decision 2008/185/EC	1995
Bluetongue In accordance with Article 8.3.3 of the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code, Sweden is regarded to be free from Bluetongue (BTV-8) as from 3 December 2010. Sweden has fulfilled all the requirements for freedom including 2 years of absence of virus circulation verified by surveillance and testing, implementation of movement restrictions and in addition mandatory vaccination for two years to ensure eradication of the disease.	2008

Rabies Antibodies of European Bat Lyssavirus have been detected in Sweden. According to Article 8.10.2. of the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code, the rabies free status of a country is not affected by the isolation of Bat Lyssavirus.	1886

Bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) The World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) has since 2008 recognized Sweden as having a negligible BSE risk status in accordance with the provisions of Article 11.6.3 of the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code. One single case was detected in 2006. This case was an atypical BSE of age-type and not related to the classical BSE epidemic.	2006
Bovine tuberculosis, brucellosis Sweden is regarded officially free from these diseases according to European Commission Decision 2003/467/EC.	Tuberculosis: 1978 Brucella abortus: 1957
